MailCall News

Leo Dean recently sent me a copy of a recent MailCall email that he printed out. Like a lot of people, Leo likes to print out the email and read it on paper. I have heard that many people like to do this, and that's often what they do to pass it on to others.

When Leo printed out the email, this one (#2003, as well as many others in the past) printed too wide. The margins were off enough that many words ran of the right side of the page and could not be read. And some of the larger photos also were cut off and caused quite a few blank pages to print. Because the formatting of emails varies for every different email service, I cannot always control the way emails might look on screen or on print.

It occurred to me that one way that I can control the way that email will look is to deliver it in a pdf format. So that's what you are getting here. This format always prints exactly as it looks. And for those who need it, it is fairly easy to zoom in. So for those with poor eyesight (and I'm getting close to that age myself), just zoom in and make the page as big as you need it to be. When you zoom in (see the instructions below), it maintains a high clarity.

I am concerned that no everyone has the Adobe Reader pdf viewer on their PC. I hope so, as it is a fairly standard format, and we have been using that for many of the attachments on the website. I included a note and link in the email on how to load the software for people who do not have it.

So here it is. The first MailCall newsletter delivered in pdf format. Please give me your feedback.


I'm not sure if anyone got any pictures of the airport plaque during the last trip. But we did get some pictures in 2006 from Gene Frice.



RE: Battle in Bergstein, Germany

My dad Mike Sura was taken off the field with two wounds in the battle described in the Mystery Trooper. Along with Dick Huggler they didn't make it back to their unit until the war had ended. He had vivid memories of this battle and didn't think he would survive. As a kid he described the machine gun an mortar fire and how the medics got the wounded through the mine field crawling in between gauze tape paths laid by the engineers. He said he believed he slept for 3 days and remembered eating cracker out of a musette bag when he awoke.

The 517th PRCT fighting strength, I believe, was reduced to the size of a company that day.. Dennis Sura - son of a buzzard.
