# Casualty Reports

To Mike Wells, can I access the morning reports for Company H on line yet?

Mike and Rhonda Wells spent a lot of time copying the H Company morning reports into a spreadsheet. I have not yet figured out how to make this into an easy to search format for the web site. I will eventually. But for anyone who knows how to use Excel, here is the Excel file of the H Company Casualty reports. I have set this up with an "auto-filter", which can be used to find anything within a column. Upon opening, the spreadsheet shows all records from June 1, 1944 to Dec 10, 1944, in order by date. If you click on the filter button of any column, you can filter or serach for entries. Try selecting "Sura" in the last name column, and you will find one record from 29 Sept 1944. – BB
