Happy Patriots' Day!

Patriots' Day (officially Patriots' Day in Massachusetts and Patriot's Day in Maine) is a civic holiday commemorating the anniversary of the Battles of Lexington and Concord, the first battles of the American Revolutionary War. It is observed in Massachusetts and Maine (once part of Massachusetts), and is a public school observance day in Wisconsin. Observances and re-enactments of these first battles of the American Revolution occur annually at Lexington Green in Lexington, Massachusetts, (around 6am) and The Old North Bridge in Concord, Massachusetts (around 9am). In the morning, a mounted reenactor with State Police escort retraces Paul Revere's ride, calling out warnings the whole way.

Since 1969, the holiday has been observed on the third Monday in April, providing a three-day long weekend. Previously, it had been designated as April 19 in observance of the anniversary of the Battles of Lexington and Concord, the first battles of the American Revolutionary War. It is also a school holiday for many local colleges and universities, both public and private.

The Boston Marathon is run on Patriots' Day every year so many Bostonians know the holiday as "Marathon Monday".

The Boston Red Sox have traditionally been scheduled to play at home in Fenway Park on Patriots' Day every year since 1959. The games were postponed due to bad weather in 1959, 1961, 1965, 1967, and 1984, and canceled in 1995 during the players' strike. Since 1968 the games have started early, in the morning, around 11:00 AM. The early start to these games usually resulted in the game ending just as the marathon is heading through Kenmore Square. However, since 2007 the marathon has started between 9:30 AM and 10:00 AM, resulting in the racers going through Kenmore towards the middle of the Red Sox game.

Subject: California Principal's Opening Address to Students

From: Dennis Prager, principal at a high school in Redding, California, on the first day of classes in 2010: To the students and faculty of our high school: I am your new principal, and honored to be so. There is no greater calling than to teach young people.

I would like to apprise you of some important changes coming to our school.

I am making these changes because I am convinced that most of the ideas that have dominated public education in America have worked against you, against your teachers, against your parents, and against our country.

Therefore: First, this school will no longer honor race or ethnicity. I could not care less if your racial makeup is black, brown, red, yellow, or white. I could not care less if your origins are African, Latin American, Asian, or European, or if your ancestors arrived here on the Mayflower or on slave ships. The only identity I care about, the only one this school will recognize, is your individual identity -- your character, your scholarship, your humanity. And the only national identity this school will care about is American. This is an American public school, and American public schools were created to make better Americans.

If you wish to affirm an ethnic, racial, or religious identity through your school, you will have to go elsewhere. We will end all ethnicity-, race- and non-American-nationality-based celebrations.. They undermine the motto of America, one of its three central values -- E Pluribus Unum -- "from many, one."

And this school will be guided by America 's values. That includes all after-school clubs. I will not authorize clubs that divide students based on any identities. This includes race, language, religion, sexual orientation, or whatever else may become in vogue in a society divided by political correctness. Your clubs will be based on interests and passions -- not blood, ethnic, racial or other physically defined ties. Those clubs just cultivate narcissism -- an unhealthy preoccupation with the self -- while the purpose of education is to get you to think beyond yourself. So, we will have clubs that transport you to the wonders and glories of art, music, astronomy, languages you do not already speak, math, carpentry, and more. If the only extracurricular activities you can imagine being interested in are those based on ethnic or racial or sexual identity, that means that little outside of yourself really interests you.

Second, I am not interested in whether or not English is your native language. My only interest in terms of language is that you leave this school speaking and writing English as fluently as possible. The English language has united America's citizens for more than 200 years, and it will unite us at this school. It is one of the indispensable reasons this country of immigrants has always come to be one



country. And if you leave this school without excellent English-language skills, I will have been remiss in my duty to ensure that you are prepared to compete successfully in the American job market We will learn other languages here -- it is deplorable that most Americans only speak English. But if you want classes taught in your native language rather than in English, this is not your school.

Third, because I regard learning as a sacred endeavor, everything in this school will reflect learning's elevated status. This means, among other things, that you and your teachers will dress accordingly. Many people in our society dress more formally for a meal at a nice restaurant than they do for church or school. Those people have their priorities backwards. Therefore, there will be a formal dress code at this school.

Fourth, no obscene language will be tolerated anywhere on this school's property -- whether in class, in the hallways or at athletic events. If you can't speak without using the "F-word," you can't speak. By obscene language I mean the words banned by the Federal Communications Commission plus epithets such as the "N-word," even when used by one black student to address another, or "bitch," even when addressed by a girl to a girlfriend. It is my intent that by the time you leave this school, you will be among the few of your age to distinguish instinctively between the elevated and the degraded, the holy and the obscene.

Fifth, we will end all self-esteem programs. In this school, self-esteem will be attained in only one way -- the way people attained it until the state of California decided otherwise a generation ago -- by earning it. One immediate consequence of this is that there will be only one class valedictorian, not eight.

Sixth, and last, I am reorienting the school toward academics and away from politics and propaganda. No more time will be devoted to scaring you about smoking and caffeine, or terrifying you about sexual harassment or global warming. No more semesters will be devoted to condom-wearing and teaching you to regard sexual relations as only or primarily a health issue. There will be no more attempts to convince you that you are a victim because you are not white, or not male, or not heterosexual, or not Christian. We will have failed, if any one of you graduates from this school and does not consider himself or herself inordinately lucky -- to be alive and to be an American.

Now, please stand and join me in the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag of the United States of America. As many of you do not know the words, your teachers will hand them out to you.

World War II memories

Remembering a happy Christmas Eve '45

Fred Marron of Utica reported for induction to the U.S. Army in July 1944 at Fort Dix, New Jersey.

He served with the 517th R.C.T. until December 1945. Here is his letter:

It happened 50 years ago when I got my greetings from Uncle Sam to report for induction in July 1944 at Fort Dix, New Jersey.

I saw a "Join the Airborne" poster and I did.

After basic and paratroop training I shipped out of Boston Harbor to Le Havre, France, and joined the 517th R.C.T. as a replacement. The 517th had already seen action in Italy and France.

At this time the Battle of the Bulge had begun and my unit was on standby for a jump into Jermany's Rhineland. Due to Patton's Third Army overruning our jump zones, several of our scheduled combat jumps were cancelled.

After the Bulge was secured and Germany surrendered the

517th was billeted in Joigney, France. At this time my brother, Edward, was serving in an antiaircraft unit with Patton's Third Army in Lintz, Austria.

He found out-that my unit was stationed close to Paris and got permission to visit me.

It was great to see him.

Although no passes were left, m commanding officer gave me a three-day pass and a jeep so my brother and I went to Paris.

Although he recently passed away, this is one of my fondest memories of my brother and our reunion in the middle of the war.

After V-E Day the 517th was offered a choice of occupation duty in Berlin or to go to the Pacific Theater. I chose the Pacific and while en route the A Bomb was dropped.

That changed everything and consequently I was among the first troops sent home.

On Christmas Eve 1945, I arrived at Union Station and walked the few blocks distance to my home. No one knew I was coming.

My brother was already home and it was a happy Christmas Eve for us all.

I joined Co C of the 2nd Bat in 43 when it was organized in Camp Toccoa. Participated in the France invasion, Battle of the Bulge and finally ended up with the 82dn Airborne when the option was given to stay in Berlin with Ike... or got to Japan. WRONG CHOICE... Japan gave up and the 517th was in New York and sent home. Our stay with Ike was pleasant duty and after a short stay we were also released.

Oh Yes, I certainly don't mean to brag about my medal award... I was just doing what I was supposed to do and lucky for me it was a success.

Anyway... hope this might be of some help to your efforts.

FORT BENNING

Friday, July 15

We'll spend the day at Fort Benning, Georgia, home of the Infantry. Today's plans include the Basic Airborne Course Graduation, Silver Wings Parachute Demo, and Airborne 5000 demo. In addition, time will be allowed in the National Infantry Museum & Soldier Center. At your leisure, you can trace the footsteps of infantrymen from the 1607 wilderness of Virginia to the 1991 sands of the Persian Gulf, from victory at Yorktown to events in Vietnam, and of course, everything in between! You'll see weapons, uniforms, footwear, mess equipment, fine oil paintings, firearms, bronzes, helmets, and vehicles from a 1902 Studebaker Utility Wagon to the legendary Jeep. The museum shows not only the weapons, uniforms, and personal equipment of U.S. infantrymen, but also that of the enemies who chose to test our resolve. World War II Street is an authentically recreated complex of seven buildings from the 1940s. The gift shop is extensive and worth visiting. Lunch will be at the Officers Club, featuring baked chicken, along with salad, sides, dessert, and beverage. All persons over sixteen years of age, must have a photo ID. As with any military institution, activities and schedules may change.

CAMP TOCCOA

Saturday, July 16

Take a trip down Memory Lane by travelling two hours north to Camp Toccoa and the Currahee Military Museum. The museum features uniforms, medals, photos, maps, weapons, and other priceless items that tell the stories. Located in the museum is a stable, built in Aldbourne, England in 1922. Companies from the 506th were housed there, and the owners donated it to the museum in honor of the paratroopers. Plans for the day are still being worked out, but the emphasis will be on the museum. We'll take a ride out to the original site of Camp Toccoa for a picture stop at Memorial Walk, a small area with memorial statues to the regiments who trained there. You'll also see the entrance to the road that leads up Currahee Mountain. Lunch will take place in the museum conference room. Buffet will include sandwiches, chips, dessert, and a drink.
