Dear Lory,

First let me congratulate you on being able to get Adm. Mullen, Chairman of the Joint Chiefs, as your keynote speaker for the Atlanta Reunion. This is an honor the unit deserves but would hardly seem within the realm of possibilities. The fact that it arose through Uncle Charlie, a member of the 3rd Battalion, is coincidence I never expected.

Charles (Chuck Boyer) whose sister, I believe, is Adm. Mullen's mother, was an exemplary airborne soldier throughout training in the States and all 5 or our major battles in Europe. He wore the airborne uniform as though it were made to fit him. He was an extraordinary physical specimen with all the endurance required for our combat missions. His unit was Headquarters 3rd Battalion. He served both in the S2 section and as 1st Sgt. of the Company. In both positions he carried out his duties as an extraordinary professional, including both combat and informational intelligence patrols deep behind enemy lines. As 1st. Sgt. he saw to it that all of the details, including paperwork, moved the company in its missions with extreme efficiency. I can attest to all this personally since Chuck served with me with distinction in the S2 section.

I will now add this, which you may or may not decide to use, in a matter of principle Chuck had a major disagreement with Capt. Pencak then commanding Headquarters 2rd. Rather than knuckle under to the Captains ideas, Chuck turned in his stripes.

Chuck was a devout Catholic and always assisted the Catholic Chaplin in all services. He had a girlfriend back home and wrote her a letter every day. Chuck had a conflict as to whether to enter the priesthood after the war or marry his sweetheart. When he was discharged, he decided on the latter.

It would not be astonishing to all those who knew Chuck in the 3rd Battalion to learn that his nephew had become Chairman of the Joint Chiefs.

Red Maline and I are the only living members who served with Chuck in the S2 section. I regret very much that I will not be able to attend the Reunion because of my physical disabilities which would require the attention of the medical staff here at the Palo Alto VA Facility.

From the National Personnel Records Center, St. Louis, Mo

Thank you for contacting the National Personnel Records Center. The Privacy Act requires a written release authorization before we can provide copies of the requested document(s). We need complete information to identify and locate the service record: complete name of veteran, branch and approximate dates of service, social security number and service number if one was issued, date and place of birth. We need a signature from the veteran, if deceased, next of kin, date, and include your mailing address. Requesters must provide proof of death, such as a copy of a death certificate, letter from funeral home or obituary.

The following is considered as Next of Kin: un-remarried spouse, father, mother, brother, sister, son and daughter. Individuals not listed may request information releasable under the Freedom Of Information Act. *** For security purposes, we will not accept request via email ***

If you are a veteran, or a deceased veteran's next of kin, the easiest way to submit your request is online at http://www.archives.gov/veterans/evetrecs/index.html

You may also submit a Standard Form 180 for this request. You can download a copy of the Standard Form 180 from our web site, http://www.archives.gov/veterans/military-service-records/standard-form-180.html.

You can send a written request that includes the above information.
