I did take a quick look through the obvious records that I have, including the December 1944 roster. Matt Greene is listed with Company G: <u>http://517prct.org/documents/xmas1944/xmas1944.htm</u>

I do know that my Dad, Ben Barrett, did trade numerous emails with your Dad over the years, and it seems that he did attend a reunion or two. You can find those emails using the search function at <u>http://517prct.org/search.htm</u> and search for "Matt Greene".

There were a couple of books written about the 517<sup>th</sup>. The Paratroopers' Odyssey was written in 1985 and is on the website, but I don't see any mention of Matt Greene in that. Bob: Somehow I missed the 10/30/11 Mail Call (<u>#2076</u>) and did not see **Howard Hensleigh's** letter until today. I apologize for not getting back to Howard and hope you can pass this note on to him.

I do remember **Lt. Emmons** and am glad to hear about his partial recovery. I had almost the same experience with **Col. Bill Boyle** who I was constantly with until he was shot in Belgium. We often played chess together, even at forward O.P.'s I last saw him when Sgt. Steele brought him in and he was shot through both arms and his chest. The building we were using as an O.P. was blown up at that time, and I left with others partially wounded. I assumed Wild Bill Boyle (who we all would have gone through hell for) was dead, and believed so until I got some news from the 517 in recent years. I also had the opportunity to correspond with Col. Boyle, and tell him of my respect for him.

We also discussed Bill Young, who Col. Boyle said was one of those mistakes you make in selecting people you need to trust. (I'm not sure of his exact words). I told Col. Boyle that I had the privilege to serve with the finest officer in the Paratroops (Col. Boyle) and the worst (Bill Young). Col. Boyle often said we were part of the Irish Mafia, Boyle, Dugan, Brodie, Kelley, etc. etc.

Dear Bob, Questions have been raised about the camouflage uniforms. These questions arise because now most Soldiers wear a permanent type. When we jumped into S. France the entire combat team members had whatever they were to wear on the jump spray painted with camouflage paint. I still have my old field jacket jumped into S. France, but the paint has faded some during the intervening years. So, the pictures you see are spray painted uniforms. We also had our faces grease painted the same way. It wore off in a few days.

As I mentioned before I was interviewed about my Dad for the T.V. spot and our own **Hoyt Kelley** of the 517th was also interviewed. Hoyt served in the S-2 section of First Battalion.

In the interview he talked about the first day when all of vou troopers were taken to the "jump Towers" that were part of an airplane fuselage. Hoyt said when it was your turn to jump a Sergeant would hit you on the leg as your signal to jump. He said one day as he was standing in line waiting to jump out on to the cable some soldier next in line was hit on the leg before he hooked up to the cable and jumped out. The soldier broke both his legs. Hoyt said the Sergeant stated, "Don't worry men. That only happens two or three times a day."



Anyway, I think everyone would have been very proud to have seen the segment about the 517th. The actors talked and talked about what a great unit the 517th was and how honored they were to portray men of this historic outfit. Again, I will have a DVD of the movie to show at the reunion. The movie doesn't open up in theaters until August 3, 2012. Also, I am told by the movie producers that someone from the movie project will be at our reunion. This should be another great reunion.
