Dick Seitz has never stopped leading. He has been instrumental in making sure the Association still exists, and still has reunions. You will never meet someone more supportive.

Dick Seitz's speech at Savannah in 2005 - still linked from the 517 main page, I believe - lives on as an incredible oral history and a concise summary of the unit. He did that speech *without notes*. It was the first time I'd heard him say, "The men of the 517 are the finest men ever to pull on a pair of jump boots," before he admitted that he'd run into some trouble over the years for standing that ground. Of course, he prefaced this by saying that he's commanded every airborne outfit that there is - which of course gives him all the credibility to say that about the 517.

It was the first time I met him in person - in the elevator after the dinner there. My father says he was standing three inches taller after hearing his commanding officer speak glowingly of how incredible they were.

So then, two years later, here I am, hosting the 2007 reunion in DC. When Dick arrived, he presented me with a pin from his own Kansas City reunion, which he'd held onto for years, thanking me for hosting.

Bertil Jansson was there attending his very first reunion. Everything had been going well for him, but then he got into an auto accident, and was devastatingly injured. He arrived in DC in a wheelchair, accompanied by his two sons. He was thrilled to be there in the hospitality suite, as people were trickling in and out in the evening. In walked Dick Seitz, and Bertil was thrilled to meet him. Automatically and out of deep respect, he struggled to rise to his feet. In a quick and gentle but firm gesture, Dick put his hand on Bert's shoulder so he couldn't continue to try to stand, and smoothly asked about his commanding officer. "**Bill Boyle?** Why, Bill Boyle was one of the finest field commanders ever..." The awkward moment passed and they continued chatting.

Bert Jansson had a great reunion. It turned out to be his only one, and I am so glad that he was able to meet Lt. General Seitz and see all his old friends. So invigorated was he during that reunion that each day, he seemed better. He graduated to his walker and, by the final banquet, his cane. I will never forget the respect in his eyes and his heart when he met Dick, and I will never forget how respectfully Dick treated him. It was a privileged view into leadership.

Happy 95th, Lt. General Seitz! It is a privilege to know you!



