

Note: Chris was one of the people who gave **Ben Barrett** the idea to build a website for the 517<sup>th</sup>, so that people could find info and do research on the unit. Here's a note from Ben in MailCall #661, March 2004:

It is unlikely that there would be a 517 website or "Mail Call" if a young man in Alabama had not sent email to people in Belgium a few years ago requesting information about his grandfather, Sgt. Bobby Liddell "F" Co. 517, and a Silver Star recipient. The request was forwarded by our a Belgian friend to me to see if I could help Chris. At that time I was just learning how to turn a computer on and so I asked my son ,Bob, how to find the information on the internet. The result was the website and later "Mail Call".

We have been able to help many relatives find information about their fathers, grandfathers and uncles, but have not been able to be of much help to Chris. We did contact one person in "F" Co. who briefly remembers Bobby Liddell and when he asked him what he did to get the Silver Star, Bobby Liddell's reply was something like "just doing what I was supposed to do".



We received **Eddy Monfort** this morning in our studios, from the village of Malempré, We talked about his latest book 'Snow and Blood' released in May.



**Douglas W. "Deacon" Jones** passed away after a wonderful 98 years of life on Thursday, December 4, 2014, at Fairview Manor. He was born in Ashland, Ky., on July 4, 1916, son of the late Ollie D. and Virginia I. Stroud Jones.

Deacon's family moved to Erie in 1929 and he began his life-long involvement in the Erie community. He was a 1935 graduate of Strong Vincent High School where he excelled in football, basketball, and track. He was also a standout athlete at Perkiomen Prep School, University of Southern California, and Temple University, where he played basketball. In April of 1940, Deacon married the love of his life, Betty Bagans from Philadelphia. In 1943 he joined the United States Army and became part of the 517th Parachute Infantry Regiment. Deacon served valiantly in the European Theater, 1944/45, jumping in and fighting through France, Italy, and at the Battle of the Bulge in Belgium, where he earned two Purple

Hearts and the Bronze Star. His fellow "Battling Buzzards" became some of his closest life-long friends. Deacon retired from National Service Engraving Company of Erie in 1976 and went on to work for Bohman Music Sales. He was on the Board of Governors for many years at H.A.N.D.S. and along with his wife they enjoyed the outdoors, especially walking, swimming, and gardening. His most proud achievement was his and Betty's raising of five children. He was very involved in coaching, cub scouting, and mentoring many young people along the way. His children and grandchildren knew him for his listening ear, selflessness, humility, compassion, great sense of humor, a person who never forgot a name or face (including dogs), and a very talented pianist. He enjoyed entertaining many and played with the Troubadoors in Erie until four months prior to his death.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by his loving wife of 72 years, Betty; one daughter and son-in-law, Barbara J. and John E. Poux; and two sisters, Esther Dale Boetcker and Virginia Roland.

He is survived by two sons, David (Fely) of Fairview and Douglas (Rhonda) of Erie; two daughters, Betsy (Robert) Eisbart of White Marsh, Md. and Barrie (Tom) Nolan of Fairview; eleven grandchildren, Marla (Jim) Nix of Silver Spring, Md., Susan (Vini) Espinoza of Washington, D.C., Daniel (Kelly) Jones of Rangeley, Maine, Darren Jones of Chicago, Ill., Diandra Jones of Tortolla, V.I., David Jones of Raleigh, N.C., Leah (Mark Schiller) Eisbart of San Francisco, Calif., Margot Eisbart of Miami, Fla., Brendan (Meaghan) Nolan of Darien, Conn., Christopher (Johanna Kao) Nolan of Rangoon, Burma, and Jessica Nolan of Chicago, Ill. He is further survived by thirteen great-grandchildren, Zoe and Ben Nix, Rio and Sky Espinoza, Zachary, Brenten, Madison and Ethan Jones, Mackenzie, Jack and Marykate Nolan, Eleanor Kao and Maya Schiller.

A memorial service will be held at the convenience of the family and along with his wife they will be inurned in Arlington National Cemetery. Arrangements were under the care of the Russell C. In a cemetery about six miles from the Dutch city of Maastricht lie buried 8,301 American soldiers who died in "Operation Market Garden" in the battles to liberate the Netherlands in the fall and winter of 1944–5. Every one of the men buried in the cemetery, as well as those in the Canadian and British military cemeteries has been adopted by a Dutch family who tend the grave and keep alive the memory of the soldier they have adopted. It is the custom to keep a portrait of "their" foreign soldier in a place of honour in their home. Annually on "Liberation Day" (May 5), Memorial Services are held for the men who died to liberate the Netherlands. The day concludes with a concert, at which "Il Silenzio" has always been the concluding piece.

In 2008 the soloist was a 13-year-old Dutch girl, Melissa Venema, backed by André Rieu and the Royal Orchestra of the Netherlands.
