MailCall News

World War II veterans' memories added 4 new photos.

In September 2014, I will start to cross the United States in order to meet and interview US military veterans. The aim: preserve their memories...



Today I had the pleasure to meet an incredible World War II veteran named **Earl Boone** at the Arizona State Veterans Home of Phoenix, Arizona.

Earl was born on December 21 1923 in Sullivan, Indiana. He used to study every morning at the high school and was free the afternoon to work 4 hours/day for a robber company. Earl also spent time playing in a basketball team. He graduated high school on June 1st 1943 but he had only 5 days to celebrate it. When he was drafted on June 6, the recruitment officer asked if there were any volunteers to join the

paratroopers. The wage was little higher than in the infantry. Earl decided to join it and was assigned to the 2nd platoon, F company of the 517th Parachute Regimental Combat Team.

He landed by sea in Anzio, Italy but he performed his first combat jump over south of France during Dragoon operation on August 15 1944. During his war time, Earl was wounded 3 times. He was first shot in the leg in the south of France, the 2nd time in the head by a shrapnel and the 3rd time by the


blast effect of an explosion. It was really nice to consider that Earl remembers well the name of many cities in France that he passed through 70 years ago.

After the war, Earl began to work for General Motors but he decided to move from Indiana to Arizona for a new job. In fact, his brother in arms from the same squad named Jack Sowell offered him a job in his own business.

Thank you very much to Earl for this wonderful meeting. I also would like to thank all the different persons of the veterans home of Phoenix who helped me to set up the meeting.

As you may already understand, the Belgian Army is, once again, facing drastic financial cutbacks over the next few years. Despite the substantial number of closings that have been effected in the past, a new wave of shut-downs for other Army Bases will soon become a reality.

Sadly, this information will quite likely pass with little fanfare or publicity through media, as it is the norm for our times. And it is my fear that people may miss one of the most tragic details these actions would include: The closing of Bastogne's Army Base and the most important Historical Marker of the defense of Bastogne by the 101st Airborne Division and attached units in World War II.

We must not lose a part of our history, and we most desperately need your help! Please spread the word of these impending closings and use every resource you may have, whether it's political; military (high ranked or other) to show the dedication we have to our history. We need to bring a very large amount of pressure upon the Belgian Government, the Department of Defense, the Military through NATO and other channels as well as the Mayor and City Council of Bastogne, if we hope to save our base.

Thanks again for signing, we need also a lot more sharing please, 10000 is a goal but far too low I'm afraid. If we want to change the decision, we might need a least a 100000 Please share with friends, neighbors, family, veterans associations, politicians, re-enactor associations, Fort Campbell Kentucky (!!), etc...
