Thanks very much for the write-up of **Father Guenette** in response to my request. I didn't know he was on the faculty of Assumption College in Worcester, Mass. prior to becoming our Chaplain. Neither do I remember Protestant Chaplain Brown and don't recall ever meeting him. Chaplain Guenette circulated freely through the 1st Battalion and I met him on several occasions. I always thought of him as my Chaplain although not being of Catholic faith, or any other, at the time. I was raised in a nonreligious family and my first church service was when I was one of the first inductees in the 506th PI at Camp Toombs (later Camp Toccoa) as it was first being built. It was in a tent, as we all were, and the service was Jewish. After the war I hurried to Toledo, Ohio and married my sweetheart who was Baptist which I soon become.

Regarding the request from Rick Van Dijk of The Netherlands for information about PFC Hubert B "Hubie" Ford, I can offer the following. I heard that Hubie was orphaned at an early age and adopted by a family somewhere in Kansas where he was raised. He was a rifleman in "C" Company and many times served as Lead Scout, and a very good one, during combat. "C" Company had been reduced to two depleted platoons after a bad night on the ridge east of Bergeval, Belgium January 5, 1945. Our Company Commander, Captain Charles E. La Chaussee, had been wounded there and Executive Officer 1st Lieutenant Sydney M. Marks was in command as we approached Logbierme, Belgium a few days later. One of the platoons had no officers and Tech. Sgt. Pete Lockhart was in charge. Hubie Ford was our Lead Scout and he was walking down the road into town (very uncharacteristic behavior of a Scout) when he was shot in the head and died soon after. "C" Company had five fatalities and twelve wounded after a two-day battle to capture Logbierme.

Chaplains' Corps of the United States Army, he volunteered for duty with the paratroopers. few days later, he was assigned as a chaplain for soldiers of the Catholic faith here. But it was a temporary appointment-or so he learned this week. For he has been notified by TTC headquar-ters at Knollwood Field that as soon as he can be replaced here, he would be allowed to transfer to a paratroop detachment for the "jumping chaplain" assignment he originally wanted.

"Young men landing in enemy territory need a chaplain," Father Guenette said today. "I am young and have all the necessary qualifications for jumping. Many of the

Before being ordained a priest, he explained, he spent two years in Belgium taking some of his religlous training and four studying philosophy just outside of Paris.

A native of New Bedford, Mass., Chaplain Guenette was a member of St. Joseph's Parish and was teaching at Assumption College prior to attending the Chaplains' School at Harvard University.

Chaplain Guenette says that one of the strangest feelings comes over him when he thinks that both the S. S. Champlaign and the S. S. Paris, two ocean-going liners that took him to Europe and back, are

now at the bottom of the sea.
"One was torpedoed," he said.
"The other was sabotaged at its dock in Le Havre."

May 27, 1944:

THREE CATHOLIC CHAPLAINS QUALIFY AS PARACHUTISTS

CAMP MACKALL, N. C.—The three Catholic chaplains attached to the paratroop regiments here have qualified as full-fledged parachutists after completing five jumps. They are the Revs. Francis P. Wagner, of Baltimore, and Germain Alfred Guenette, of Worcester, Mass., who have eight jumps to their credit, and Edward Schlotterback, who has six.

Carrying the usual paratrooper equipment, minus weapons of any sort, the chaplains accompany regiments on peaceful missions or on their landings at the battle fronts.
