

Subject: PIR or PRCT?

Hey Bob,

This doesn't have to be placed on Mail Call, but I don't believe I've ever truly understood when and why the change took place.

On **Uncle Floyd Stott**'s cross, in Henri Chapelle, it states 517th PIR. Why wouldn't it be 517th PRCT?

No big hurry...just my own curiosity.

Hi Kent,

You are not the first to ask. The short answer is that the 517<sup>th</sup> PIR was one of the 4 original PIRs formed at Camp Toccoa as Paratroopers were first formally trained for WW2. (501, 506, 511, 517) The 517<sup>th</sup> Parachute Regimental Combat Team (PRCT) was created when 517th PIR was merged with the 460th Parachute Field Artillery Battalion and Company C, 139th Airborne Engineer Battalion (which became the 596<sup>th</sup> PCEC). The 517th PIR was at Camp Toccoa, Georgia; the 460th and C/139 were at Camp Mackall, North Carolina. The idea is that by including engineers, artillery, plus medical and service companies, the PRCT could be a self-contained, rapid response, independent unit.

There were many Parachute Infantry Regiments (PIR's). The 501<sup>st</sup>, 502<sup>nd</sup>, 503<sup>rd</sup>, and 504<sup>th</sup> were formed even before Camp Toccoa. Others were the 506<sup>th</sup>, 507<sup>th</sup>, 508<sup>th</sup>, 511<sup>th</sup>, 513<sup>th</sup>, and 515<sup>th</sup>. There might be others. Most of these were formed in around 1942 as the paratroopers were created for WW2. I don't know how many are still active. Even the 506<sup>th</sup> was incorporated into the 101<sup>st</sup> Airborne Division in 2014.

Most of the PIRs were attached to different Divisions, as needed, similar to the 517<sup>th</sup>. However, to my knowledge, and I could be wrong, besides the 517<sup>th</sup> PRCT, the only other combined Parachute Regimental Combat Team that I am aware of was the 503<sup>rd</sup> PRCT, consisting of the 503<sup>rd</sup> PIR combined with the 462d Parachute Artillery Battalion and the 161st Parachute Engineer Company. The 503<sup>rd</sup> PRCT fought in the Pacific during WW2. The 503<sup>rd</sup> PIR (not the full PRCT) was also reactivated later and fought in Korea, Vietnam, and even recently in Afghanistan.



During Christmas night 1944, the Head Quater from XVIIIth. . Airbornes Corps told to take "Cost to cost "Manhay's crossroads, and during these hard and cold night, the 2th. PZ SS Div. " Das Reich " was stopped.

It was the 517th. R.C.T. who was there in the morning with only

I3 survivors!

How forget all soldiers of your Regiment dead for our Freedom! Welcome at Manhay, with all respect and friendship we must send

you.

Now at Manhay, we have a little"Historic Fondation", since two years, when Veterans come in our area, we ask them about remembers and memories from their " war experiences in our area.
