

During World War II, nearly 500,000 Purple Heart medals were manufactured in anticipation of the estimated casualties resulting from the planned Allied invasion of Japan. To the present date, total combined American military casualties of the seventy years following the end of World War II—including the Korean and Vietnam Wars—have not exceeded that number. In 2003, there remained 120,000 Purple Heart medals in stock.

The existing surplus allowed combat units in Iraq and Afghanistan to keep Purple Hearts on-hand for immediate award to soldiers wounded in the field.


If you'd like to send something, please do.

### 517th Parachute Regimental Combat Team

Please remove my husband's name from your mailing list. He passed away August 30, 2013. His name is **Grant E. Doherty**, 606 E. Royal Palm Square South, Phoenix, Arizona 85020-3638. Thank you.

I see Dave's massive frustration as he tries to decipher his father's discharge papers.

My father served with the 17th Airborne (Company C of the 139th Engineer Battalion), the 517th, the 596th, was also attached to the 36th and lots of other outfits including the 82nd. There were even more during the months he was in the hospital. He closed out the war with the 13th Airborne, but his discharge papers, issued at Fort Dix on or about December 19, 1945, reflected a tank destroyer outfit.

He never even saw a tank destroyer outfit.

Dad tells me that at the time, they were taking whole bunches of guys leaving, putting them together into homeward-bound outfits in kind of temporary assignments.

Dad was told that it could have been corrected, but he didn't bother. Stupidly, he now tells me.

The point is that it's entirely possible that the discharge papers were done in similar fashion. Remember the massive effort to get as many guys as possible home for Christmas. Accuracy wasn't necessary the main goal.

Just throwing it in the pot.
