Lt. John W. Casselman was awarded a bronze star (posthumously):

First Lieutenant John W. Carseiman, Ol 309 216, 517th Farachute Infantry, United States Army, for hereic achievement in action. On 18 August 1914 First Lieutenant Casselman received orders to move his platoon from Levens, France to the east, to contact the enemy and to maintain that contact. The platoon occupied the village of Luceram, France, and had established an outpost on the high ground surrounding the area when a German patrol of twelve men tried to re-entor the town. So skillfully did First Lieutenant Casselman deploy his men that six of the enemy were killed and six taken prisoner. On the following day, First Lieutenant Casselman received orders to move his platoon to Piera Cavn. Shortly after occupying Piera Cava, a German patrol of fifty well armed men was taken by surprise In this action six of the enemy were killed, four wounded and three surrendered. First Lieutenant Casselman directed mortar fire upon the remainder of the patrol, causing fifteen additional casualties. Entered the military service from Watertown New York,







517th PARACHUTE RE-UNION INVADED THE FRENCH QUARTER OF NEW DRLEANS WITHOUT A CASUALTY ON AUG. 12 Although everywhere you looked, and on every corner in the French Quarter of New Orleans, there were clearly visable signs reading " OFF LIMITS 517th PARACHUTE RE-UNION", with a number of years of wisdom, and cautious approach, some 350 former Troopers, Wives and kids captured and conquered the whole French Quarter without a single known casualty. The Royal Sonesta Hotel, & Command Post Hqs. was then the scene of many a handshake and head scratching trying to remember old faces and glad to see more familar faces of other recent re-unions. As time went by, there casualties se n fan mie an at check paying time in various clubs and restaurants, however this type casualty is always expected when in old New Orleans. First a well deserved thanks, to Ed & Nite Jolly, Re-Union Chairmen, who did a great job setting up the whole re-union, althought they lived some 300 miles away. A special thanks to thoes who helped Ed & Nita too. Ed & Nita want to add, that they surely hoped everyone enjoyed the re-union just half as much as they enjoyed putting it on. A few other casualties of minor nature were, Gene Brinkman, G.Co., arrived and found no room,

A vew other casaries of minor nature were, dene drinkman, 5.10., arrived and found no room, & with tactful approach, Ed Jolly, Gene Champlin, Hq. 1, Dr. Phil DiStanislao, A. Co. managed to set Gene up in a supply room with requisioned rollaway bed, although a little later someone was heard screaming up and down the hall about a lost rollaway bed....A groupe of early birdsbirds , had to borrow waiters jacket to get in a very swank restaurant, at which time Joe Williams, B Co., & Jim Wallis Hq. 1, presented their old buddy, Al Sobel C. Co., with his old tennis shoes, they had stolen from him in earlier years on an Oregon fishing trip, Al graciously accepted the bronzed-plaque shoes with a few choice words, no one was thown out of the place, so thus these early birds & path finders made it more easy for the main groupe to be fully accepted in the French Quarter. It was reported the closest of anyone being thrown in juil, was Funky Dungeon and a few other wild "Northwesterners" keepone place going until 8:30 A.M. Reportedly, Erle Ehly slipped into an "Off Limits place, Pat O'Brians, and set that place up for the arriving troopers. A couple of Texas boys, Ed Ellington & Darrell Wells Hq. 1st lost their shoes, and were found later in a rather unique place. The Hotel management broke up one 4:30 A.M. symming party, which devoloped later into a Breinan's Breakfast, which brought about some more minor pocket book casualties. There were many other capers, which would take a month to write
