
This is our tenth visit, I think, for August events since we first went in 2004, and our first without constant companion **Leo Dean**. I had so hoped that he'd recover to return.

Wallace Fitzgerald Beery (April 1, 1885 – April 15, 1949) was an American film actor.^[1] He is best known for his portrayal of Bill in <u>*Min and Bill*</u> opposite <u>Marie Dressler</u>, as <u>Long John Silver</u> in <u>*Treasure Island*</u>, as <u>Pancho Villa</u> in

<u>Viva Villa!</u>, and his titular role in <u>The Champ</u>, for which he won the <u>Academy Award for Best Actor</u>.

Beery appeared in some 250 movies during a 36-year career. His contract with <u>MGM</u> stipulated in 1932 that he be paid \$1 more than any other contract player at the studio, making him the highest paid actor in the world.

His first wife was Gloria Swanson.

History-laden Hyaks 'mail call' for World War II Vets

The last day of school proved to be a history lesson in real life experience for members of the returning Hyak football and girls basketball teams last week.

On Thursday, led by football coach Todd Bridge and basketball coach Larry Moore, the junior Hyaks paid a visit to five survivors of World War II at the Brookdale senior assisted living community. The students, sporting balloons, flowers, cards, letters and decorated envelopes, then presented "mail call" to the veterans.

The veterans included Correen "Corky" Peterson, who was an Air Force nurse during World War II, the Korean War, and then the Vietnam War; Arnold Samuels, who returned to Nazi Germany for the U.S. Army to hunt down war criminals after his family had been forced to flee Hitler because they were Jewish; Norm Ross, a paratrooper who took part in the Battle of the Bulge; Woody Howard, who served in occupied France; Jim Degestien, and Tim Hey.

Bridge said while teaching his American history class about World War II, he realized that "in two weeks time we could never possibly learn it all."

They watched a video on Netflicks called "Honor Flight," which describes the annual program to fly World War II vets back to Washington, D.C., to visit the World War II National Monument, Arlington National Cemetery and other national landmarks.

"I was so moved by it, that I showed it to my students," Bridge explained of the inspiration behind the tribute locally.

Samuels last year was on the Honor Flight, accompanied by William Sisco of the North Beach Veterans of Foreign War as his guardian, and both were part of the ceremony on Thursday.

"You can study the Bataan death march, and you can study Iwo Jima, and you can study the Battle of the Bulge, but you don't hear from the people that were there, and you don't see the human side of it," Bridge said.

So he got his junior students together to plan a visit to the local veterans.

"They over-exceeded what I was hoping for," Bridge said. "This is a two-part project that gives honor to you folks who stopped their lives, some at the same age of the people here with you, and then you went out and took on the world's baddest people on this planet."

When that generation returned from the war, "you built America great," he added to a round of applause.

The students then individually helped the veterans open their envelopes and thanked them each for their service to the country.

Bridge said the visit was set up with the help of Becky Fruh, whose children attend North Beach, and who works as a nurse at Brookdale.

"She told me that they had five World War II veterans there, so I just got this spur-of-the-moment idea," Bridge said. "And this was their final project."
