To Whom It May Concern:

My name is Joe Figueiredo and I have been researching the death and burial in an unknown grave of **Pvt. Robert R. Gruwell** of Company G of the 517 PIR, for use in a possible exhibit in the Soldier Experience Gallery at the U.S. Army Heritage and Education Center in Carlisle, PA.

I would like to submit for consideration by Army officials a photograph found on your site submitted by Ms. Shelly Azeff taken by her father, **Lt. Warren Caufield**. The photograph is number 60 and is of two wrecked German vehicles which as I understand it is the location at which Pvt. Gruwell met his death. The photograph was also used by **Jean-Loup Gassend** in his "Autopsy of a Battle." It was he who advised me to ask Ms. Azell for permission to use the photograph. Therefore, would you please forward this email to Ms. Azell for me?

I find the story of Pvt. Gruwell very compelling in that he was apparently accidentally killed by his own hand grenade, but then the location his grave has been unknown for all these years. I can only imagine his family's grief upon being notified of his death and then to be notified that his remains have been lost. Should Army officials decide to use his story as a part of the Soldier Experience Gallery, a process which may take about three years, I believe visitors will better appreciate the many sacrifices made by our Veterans and that not all are accounted for.
