The St Crispin's Day speech is from Shakespeare's history play *Henry V*, in Act IV Scene iii 18–67. In the speech, which fell on Saint Crispin's Day, Henry V urged his men – who were vastly outnumbered by the French – to recall how the English had previously inflicted great defeats upon the French. The speech by Shakespeare has been famously portrayed by Laurence Olivier to raise British spirits during the Second World War, and by Kenneth Branagh in the 1989 film *Henry V*, and it made famous the phrase "band of brothers." The play was written around 1600, and several later writers have used parts of it in their own texts.

I received a message to our 517th Reenacting group Facebook page about a grave marker for **Deole Harter Priddy** of the 596th that was found recently.

We are trying to find out if this was discarded due to an error on the marker or if it needs to be properly placed. It is in the Smartsville, CA area.

Our group is working on an answer but we appreciate any help or information.

I haven't found too much about DeOle Priddy in my records. He is listed the December 1944 Christmas roster. And there are a couple of brief mentions about him in the 596th Wings newsletters:

May 1981:

Bill Hudson isn't sure about making the Reunion. He tried to telephone De Ole Priddy In Alaska but had no luck in Fairbanks or Anchorage.

May 1983:

DeOle Priddy, whom we just recently located, and his wife Donna have 5 children, 4 girls and 1 boy. De Ole has been in heavy construction all over the west coast and Alaska but presently he is taking it a bit easier as he recovers from a heart attack last July. Drop him a welcoming line if you have the time. He is delighted to hear from our gang and plans to be at the reunion.

December 1985:

De Ole Priddy moved and we presently do not have a mailing address for him.

Sorry, Matt, but that's all I can find. Nothing about any obituary, and nothing in FindAGrave or anywhere else about where he ended up being buried.






Camp Toccoa at Currahee honors 75th anniversary of D-Day

I've tried to find records about Jack and George Dunaway. I'm still not sure if they might have been confused. This photo is from a website that no longer exists. But I do see a Corporal Jack G. Thanks-to the reply's of Jack Dunaway inquiry, One said he was a delightful person?? A lot of you may recall his wearing a Carol Channing hair-piece to the mini in Palm Springs reunion?? Everyone that saw him smiled real big, Typical Jack,?? I was surprised to hear him say to me that he knew he was the 517 clown, in Palm Springs, He had to be 10 years older than us 18 year olds in Toccoa, Always had a funny story for us, mostly made up??stuff?? That would make him 90 or so today if still with us?? At a reunion in San Antonio, Jack and I had finished our Banquet dinner and walked to the bar, for a drink, A lady steps up from another table, she had been told that I was the Chef, that had prepared this very good meal we had just ate?? and she wanted to Thank-me for the fine meal,?? What else to do but turn her over to the real Chef, Jack Dunaway?? walking behind me, Jack had heard her inquiry and without missing a beat said Yes I am the Chef, and I would do anything for these 517 men, but Thank-You anyway?? Jack claims to have been in a movie in Hollywood just before he came to the 517. portraying Paratroopers, I believe it was Objective Burma with Errol Flynn, I have the movie but have not found Jack yet as one of the extras, It had to be another movie as the 517 was photographed making a jump in No. Carolina on a very windy day and it is the scene in the movie?? I will do that John, My past experience with Jack and his number at work, was The secretary answered the phone and says who is calling?? I tell them and 10-15 minutes later still no Jack??? So I hung up the phone??? a few months later I ask Jack at Palms Springs, how come you don't come to the phone when someone calls you????He claims I answer my phone on the first ring every time??????? That was the time I got up early one morning in Palm Springs and find Jack Dunaway jogging in front of the hotel, back and forth maybe 30 Ft. turning around and back the other way?? He could not see me so I just watched and he carried on with this for 15 minutes or so??? No one else saw him that I know of, O! Yes Jack claims he gets up everyday at 5:17 sharp??? Tom McAvoy

Hi Ben~~

This is pretty long but interesting. Do with it whatever you think is best.

Lud and I went to the Memorial Service for Jack Dunaway on Saturday. I'm forwarding this photo of Jack and his son, Michael, (taken in late '43 or early '44) along with a synopsis of his obituary. His ex-wife wrote the obit. She told us that they had remained friends throughout his life. He did many things in his life that I think anyone who knew him might be interested in.

He was born in Oklahoma in 1914. His maternal grandmother was a full-blooded Indian of the Cherokee Nation. He enjoyed growing up with friends and relatives as part of the Cherokee culture.

Jack was very interested in school and graduated from High School at age 16. He graduated summa cum laude from college at the age of 19. After graduation a cousin working in the casting department at 20th Century Fox in Hollywood told him he might be able to get him work at the studio for \$50 a week (1936). Several screen tests later Jack was under contract. He soon became one of its most in-demand stunt men, particularly in Westerns. As a Cowboy, and sometimes as a feathered Indian, Jack took falls for the likes of Clark Gable, Joel McCrae, Roy Rogers and Gene Autry as well as on countless Studio location film sets.

Jack met actress, Virginia Wicks, on a Paramount Studios set where they were shooting "Wells Fargo." Jack was Joel McCrae's stand-in for the film. Later that year Jack and Virginia married. They had one child, a son, Michael Wicks Dunaway. Not long after, Virginia was under contract to the Samuel Goldwyn Studios. She was a Goldwyn Girl.

At the outbreak of World War II Jack enlisted and trained as a paratrooper. He served with the 517th PRCT.

Returning to California after the War, Jack set up a driving school in Hollywood and attended night courses, earning his law degree and passing the State Bar of California January 14, 1954. He soon after opened a small office at Hollywood and Vine.


An important thread in Jack's life was always the yearly gathering of Jack's parachute combat team, the veterans of the 517th. He never missed going until his health finally deteriorated to the point where he was unable to attend.

In 1973, Jack met Yoko Seto, a Hollywood film editor. She remained a faithful companion of Jack's for the rest of his life.


Last week I had lunch with Jack Dunaway in Los Angeles.
