I say fitting because our Dad and Tom Cross were the closest of friends for life. So here they are like bookends-reminds me of the picture I see every day of Dad and Tom standing outside I think a "command center" (some farmer's building) during the war.

Dad loved Tom like a dear brother so much so Tom was Dad's best man at our parents' wedding on June 23, 1945 in France. Tom was such a man of integrity, honor, valor and incredible kindness. He was so integral in our family's story he was like an adopted uncle. He and his wife Bette were the salt of the earth with the Airborne maverick "can do", unsinkable and big hearts. They were a great couple and so very special to be around.

While it is indeed very sad for us that Tom is no longer with us—he is the last of the 517th's commanding officers I believe, and for the Seitz clan we have had severed our last living link to our Dad and Mom, I can only imagine the great reunion and celebration now that Tom is reunited with Bette and his Band of Brothers especially our Dad who so admired, respected and loved Tom.

God is so good that He gave us such great men of character who were so selfless that they put their country and its welfare before themselves as outstanding leaders, commanders devoted to the wellbeing of their troops and contributors to the well-being of their families and communities after their service. Hi Damian,

On some quick research, I found some old MailCall notes (below) that mention Gene Harms. Most from Ron Robinson in 2006. Since I do not see Gene on the December 1944 roster, my best guess is that he joined soon after during the Battle of the Bulge.

And I did find PFC Harold E Harms listed on the passenger manifest list of the Madawaska Victory ship - Pg 64

Ben: Been trying to find out information about my brother in law Harold Eugene Harms who served in the 517th from late summer 1944 through the end of the war in Europe. He is still living. According to him he arrived in Europe and was based just north of Paris. Jumps were planned but not completed because Allied forces kept overrunning the drop targets. In the end he saw no action and was then targeted for Pacific duty. While crossing the US on the way to the west coast the war ended in the Pacific. I have found no reference to him or any action that follows his comments about being based north of Paris.

Would love to get his info out to see if others remember him.




