You will soon receive the official letter from our project chair Cynthia Brown, who just lost a brother to Covid19, but I wanted to pass along our thanks quickly.

Just to update you on the progress of the 517<sup>th</sup> barrack, it is about 2/3 finished, the windows (original Camp Toccoa) were just installed the first week of December. We have obtained the donation of the materials to do the inside and will have it insulated at the end of December. We just received a generous donation to cover the cost of the siding for the outside and are working to get the installation of this siding scheduled. We hope to get the funds for the HVAC system in Feb/Mar timeframe. Our goal is to have the 517<sup>th</sup> barrack completed by D-Day 2021. We are currently looking for a 517<sup>th</sup> uniform to display on a mannequin in the 517<sup>th</sup> when it is completed. We have a replica of a 506<sup>th</sup> man uniform in the just completed 506<sup>th</sup> and visitors are pleased to see it. Please put out this notice to other descendants of 517<sup>th</sup> men, it would be wonderful to have a uniform from a 517<sup>th</sup> man on display in the 517<sup>th</sup> barrack.

Rest in peace Allan. And we will see again, for sure. 💭





Yes, the numbers of remaining 157<sup>th</sup> troopers is getting smaller. I try to keep track of those that have written in and attended past reunions. I think the remaining troopers probably number less than 50, although most are not online and I haven't heard from in several years. There are about 400 people



who signed up for MailCall over the years, with about 100 to 150 are active readers. I know most of the regulars and consider them as long-time very close friends and family. I just keep the MailCall and website going as a decent historical record and tribute to these great men. Since the 517<sup>th</sup> was an independent "orphan" special operations unit during their entire short existence, there is not much of a formal historical record, so my Dad and I jut felt the need to collect what records and stories we could get our hands on. I am often surprised at how many relatives from the next generations still reach out to find out about their family and the 517th.

I know that your Grandfather served closely with Bill Boyle in HQ/1. But I cannot find any pictures of John Marsinko in my records or reunion photos, so I do I look forward to any stories and pictures you might have for the website.

### From **Eddy Monfort** in Belgium:



She was known as the "GI Nightingale,[1]" a forces sweetheart, who entertained troops touring often with Bob Hope.

**Pvts. Richard and Roger Tallakson** were both in A Battery of the 460<sup>th</sup> PFAB. I had forgotten that these identical twins were in the 460<sup>th</sup>, and they were allowed to serve in the same unit.

Two members of the 460th Parachute Field Artillery Battalion, Roger and Richard Tallakson, were identical twins. They had asked to jump from separate airplanes so Mom and Pop wouldn't get a double jolt in a single telegram from the War Department in Washington, D.C. When the green lights flashed in their respective C-47 cabins, they leaped into the dark unknown. Roger landed some twenty-five miles from his designated drop zone, and Richard crashed to earth thirty miles from his target field. After daylight, each twin began asking other troopers for information on his missing brother. Richard heard that Roger had been killed, Roger was told that Richard died. Two days later, the twins were joyously reunited in an assembly area. Neither had been injured.
