



Toccoa native releases book about paratrooper father

Former Toccoa resident, Jim Hewitt, was a graduate of the United States Army's first paratrooper school at Ft. Benning, Georgia in 1941. After completing paratrooper training, he was transferred to Camp Toccoa as a member of the 506th Paratrooper Infantry Regiment and later to the 517th Parachute Infantry Regiment serving as a jump instructor under the command of Lt. Col. Robert Sink.

Jim's son, John Hewitt, a 1975 graduate of Stephens County High School, chief operating officer and award-winning columnist for The Champion Newspaper in Decatur, Georgia has written Broken Wings: a brother left behind which recounts Jim's early years in coastal South Carolina of being born into a prominent family whose wealth was lost due to a series of devastating events that ultimately landed Jim in an orphanage at the age of six.

Broken Wings tells a story of how Jim's early years instilled determination and discipline that ultimately brought him to Currahee, and why after two terms of enlistment and six years of service he had to leave it all behind.

Co-editor of *Broken Wings* and Toccoa native, Deidra Gaines, described the book as "highlighting one of the most important chapters in our country's military history; the reader will encounter an array of human emotions, obstacles, and struggles. The journey entails love, loss, success, failure, honor, humility, regret, and the interwoven aftermath of all."

Broken Wings: a brother left behind will be available on a number of online sites including Amazon Books in hard copy and digital formats. A book signing will be held at Currahee Vineyards during this year's Military Weekend in October.




Honor Through Sacrifice: The Story of One of America's Greatest Military Leaders

"A man can fight if he can see daylight down the road somewhere," President Lyndon Johnson told a senator in March 1965. "But there ain't no daylight in Vietnam—there's not a bit." Even as he said that, he was committing the first US ground combat units and initiating a massive bombing campaign in North Vietnam. Overcoming great challenges in the Army, he earned the Distinguished Service Cross and two battlefield commissions, and became a hero among heroes. He focused on the mission at hand, rallied his troopers, led from the front, and dodged enemy bullets. A couple of times they hit home, but he came back to fight again! He was one of those studs to come out of small-town America and become a leading member of "The Greatest Generation." This is a sweeping story on the broad landscape of twentieth-century compromise, accommodation, and conflict, from the allied war in Europe to the forgotten war in Korea to the televised dinnertime war in Vietnam.
