
Tom Cross, Jr.

U.S. Army Remembers Betty White's World War II Service: 'A True Legend'

December 31, 2021

While Hollywood mourns the loss of iconic television star Betty White, who died Friday at the age of 99, the U.S. Army is remembering the actress for a role she played off the screen: that of World War II volunteer.

In a statement issued Friday on Twitter, the Army said it was "saddened by the passing of Betty White," adding that she had a personal history with the military branch.

"Not only was she an amazing actress, she also served during WWII as a member of the American

Women's Voluntary Services. A true legend on and off the screen," the statement concluded.



While White began working as an actress and model in the late 1930s, her aspirations were put on hold during the Second World War. A month before her 20th birthday in 1941, she went to work with the American Women's Voluntary Services (AWVS).

The AWVS provided women volunteers to offer services such as ambulance and truck driving, fire-fighting, aircraft-spotting, navigation, and aerial photography.

In a 2010 interview with Cleveland magazine, White talked about her assignment — driving a truck of supplies to barracks in the Hollywood Hills — and attending dances for the troops ahead of their deployments abroad.

"It was a strange time and out of balance with everything," White told Cleveland, "which I'm sure the young people are going through now. We'll never learn. We'll never learn."





From what I can find, it appears the 517th operated under the 13th, 17th, & 82nd Divisions at one point and time

Hi Karl.

I done some quick searching of my 517th PRCT records (which are very incomplete),but haven't found any specific mention of William Wickert. Not conclusive yet, and I will continue digging.

Yes, the 517th PRCT was an independent unit and was under both the 17th and 13th Airborne at different times.

But there were at least two other 517 designated groups in WWII, including the 517th Airlift Squadron, the 517th Airborne Signal Company, and the 517th Air Service Group. The Signal Company was part of the 17th Airborne. (Are you sure the initials are not "SC"?).

The Air Service Group was most likely referred to as a Service Group (SG), since they were all part of Airborne units. The 517th ASG was formed near the end of WWII, mostly located at airfields in Italy. I don't think the Air Service Group was assigned to a specific Division, but probably supported any Airborne group that needed them.

For it's brief existence during World War II, the 517th had a lot of intermingling


The hunt and search continues.

To answer your question, yes, the 517th PRCT, including the 596th only made one combat jump into southern France. There were other in planning, including into Germany, but the never occurred.



A WWII Propaganda Campaign Popularized the Myth That Carrots Help You See in the Dark

How a ruse to keep German pilots confused gave the Vitamin-A-rich vegetable too much credit


During the 1940 *Blitzkrieg*, the *Luftwaffe* often struck under the cover of darkness. In order to make it more difficult for the German planes to hit targets, the British

government issued citywide blackouts. The Royal Air Force were able to repel the German fighters in part because of the development of a new,

secret radar

technology. The on-board Airborne Interception Radar (AI), first used by the RAF in 1939, had the ability to pinpoint enemy bombers before they reached the English Channel. But to keep that under wraps, according to Stolarczyk's research pulled from the files of the Imperial War Museum, the Mass Observation Archive, and the UK National Archives, the Ministry provided another reason for their success: carrots.

In 1940, RAF night fighter ace, John Cunningham, nicknamed "Cat's Eyes", was the first to shoot down an enemy plane using Al. He'd later rack up an impressive total of 20 kills—19 of which were at night. According to "Now I Know" writer Dan Lewis, also a Smithsonian.com contributor, the Ministry told newspapers that the reason for their success was because pilots like Cunningham ate an excess of carrots.
